The Mountrail County Health Foundation of Stanley, ND was established November 22, 1991 and received their non-profit status a year later. The foundation was originally organized to generate charitable dollars from community members to assist with the increasing shortfalls of Medicare, Medicaid and Blue Cross reimbursements.

Tribute/Memorial Giving can either be made online with a credit card/EFT or by mailing a check to the above address.


3. Gifting of Real Estate, Securities or Oil Interests

PARTNERING FOR THE FUTURE CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

In October of 2013, the Mountrail County Health Foundation implemented the “Partnering for the Future” Capital Campaign to meet the funding needs of the three construction phases outlined on the back of this brochure. With the help of generous local residents, churches, business owners, the T.H. Reiarson Trust and key energy companies the Foundation has been able to raise a little over 6 million dollars to date.

PHASE ONE: ER REMODEL, ADDITION OF A CT SCANNER SUITE AND AN ENCLOSED AMBULANCE BAY - PROJECT COMPLETE - TOTAL PROJECT COST: \$1.5 MILLION

- Remodeled the old operating room into an ER Suite • Moved the Nurse’s Station to be by the ER
- Added a Decontamination Room • Enclosed the Ambulance Bay • Moved the patient Waiting Room to front of the hospital
- Created a registration area where the old hospital Nursing Station was added a CT Scanner Suite to the North end of Ambulance Bay



PHASE TWO: EXPANSION OF THE T.H. REIARSON RURAL HEALTH CLINIC - PROJECT COMPLETE - TOTAL PROJECT COST: \$2.5 MILLION

- Increased number of exam rooms from 7 to 15 to allow more patient visits and recruit specialists
- Added a small Conference Room
- Larger Reception Area

PHASE THREE: NEW MOUNTRAIL BETHEL HOME - PROJECT CURRENTLY ON HOLD - TOTAL PROJECT COST: \$12.5 MILLION

- Two story 48 bed skilled nursing home
- New Activity and Dining Rooms in the new addition
- Remodel the existing Dining Room into a larger kitchen and a conference room
- Transform the current Activities area into the new Chapel

THE T.H. REIARSON TRUST CAN ONLY GIVE FUNDING TO THE MOUNTRAIL COUNTY MEDICAL CENTER SOLELY FOR IMPROVEMENTS AND EQUIPMENT.

Mr. Reiarson was a life-long farmer, who lived south of Ross. In his Last Will and Testament, he created this trust for the benefit of the Stanley Community Hospital.

Mr. Reiarson was specific in his will that the trust be prudently managed by the SCH board. This trust has been helping with improvements for the hospital since the late 1970's. In the Fall of 2013, as the Mountrail County Health Foundation was reviewing possible ways to finance the three phases of construction that the Mountrail County Health Center wanted to complete, an interesting discovery was made. Upon a close reading of Mr. Reiarson's will, they found this statement: "It is my desire and wish that said Trustees shall cause to be erected a new medical clinic building for the hospital and if the Trustees shall so concur, shall be known as the Reiarson Clinic." When Mr. Reiarson created this Trust and stated the above, he more than likely had no idea that the Trust would have the resources to make a commitment at this level. The SCH Board is sure that if he were alive today, Mr. Reiarson would be proud of this new facility, now known as the T.H. Reiarson Rural Health Clinic, which has been built in his honor for the community of Stanley. He also would also be amazed at how his trust could help pay for the following over the last three years:

- **\$2,410,406.60** for the building of the T.H. Reiarson Rural Health Clinic
- **\$1,413,685.70** for the Electronic Healthcare Records systems
- **\$179,890.58** for signage, furnishing and technology for the new clinic
- **\$11,080.00** for the new www.stanleyhealth.org website
- **\$147,485.20** for equipment for the hospital and clinic such as a portable ultra-sound, Nurses Call Station, CT Scanner, Bathing System, CR Reader for X-Ray and a Glidescope
- **\$1,837.47** for training for Hospital and Clinic Billing Staff
