



Mountrail County Health Foundation sponsored several community events again during the year of 2019. These events ranged from bringing in Janet Maxson to speak at a 2nd Annual Heart Healthy Women's Expo to encouraging everyone throughout town to Wear Red, Get Caught Doing it and be Rewarded! We also partnered with the Stanley Public Schools and the Stanley Park District for the 3rd Annual "Back 2 School Bash" in the High School east parking lot. This collaborative project included local churches donating school supplies so the kids could shop while they were there, the Mountrail County Medical Center offering reduced priced physicals, and the Upper Missouri District Health Unit performing immunizations. A huge thank you to the awesome Blue Jay Touch the Truck participants: Stanley Fire Department, Stanley Ambulance Service, Stanley Police Department and Mountrail Williams Electric Cooperative for their Powertown Demo. Last, but certainly not least, thank you to Dayne's Icy Treat Delight for providing the yummy ice cream treats to everyone got to eat compliments of the Stanley Park District!

The Foundation continues to partner with the local churches, Cash Wise, the Stanly Park District and the Stanley Public School's to fund a program that helps provide nutritious food to children in need in our area. The S.A.C.K. program provides weekend meals for 50 Elementary children per week and numerous High School students through the pantry located at the H.S. We thank you for donating to this cause!

Twenty two Stanley, Powers Lake and Berthold High 7th and 8th Graders were able to attend Scrubs Academy, a four day/three night camp held on the University of North Dakota campus in June because of the Foundation. The Scrubs Academy encourages middle school students from across North Dakota to pursue a career in healthcare. Students participate in hands-on activities and received information related to a variety of healthcare professions. The Foundation sponsored SCRUBS Camp again this year with the Center for Rural Health. This event is a day long camp for High School Scrubs Camp for grades 9th - 12 Grade, during which ten presenters are brought in to talk to the students what led them into the Medical Profession. Each presenter also brought interactive equipment to give the students hands on experience in their scope of practice.

The Foundation, Park District and SHS's hosted "Skittle Skool II" at the High School for all 7th—12th Graders again this past April. We brought back the 20 plus presenters that covered 11 topics ranging from Sexting to Drug Exposure and its Effects. This time they focused on the message, "Now you know what hidden dangers are out there....here are the coping skills to address them." During the week of Skittle Skool II, the Foundation brought in Teen Suicide/Mental Health Motivational Speaker Jeff Yalden. He spent the day in the five schools that fall under the area of impact for the Mountrail County Health Foundation. These schools are Stanley, Powers Lake, New Town, Parshall and Berthold/Plaza.

Stemming from the week of Jeff Yalden, Skittle Skool II, and from the CHNA results, the Foundation has taken on the responsibility of addressing Mental Health needs in the community, and being the front end funder of the Dare to Define YOU youth program. As a part of this program, we brought Jeff back to the schools he visited this past spring. Future plans for this program include hosting many more events to increase public education about mental health in the years to come.

With a full tournament again this year, we were able to raise over \$12,400! This money went towards Broda chairs and a Spa Room for our MBH residents.

The T.H. Reiarson Trust can only give funding to the Mountrail County Medical Center solely for improvements and equipment.

Mr. Reiarson was a life-long farmer, who lived south of Ross. In his Last Will and Testament, he created this trust for the benefit of the Stanley Community Hospital. T.H. was specific in his will that the trust be prudently managed by the SCH board. This trust has been helping with improvements for the hospital since the late 1970's. He would be amazed at how his trust could help pay for the following over the last six years:

- \$2,410,406.60 for the building of the T.H. Reiarson Rural Health Clinic
- \$1,731,577.33 for the Electronic Healthcare Records systems
- \$249,725.46 for signage, furnishing and technology for the new clinic, such as the new electronic billboard
- \$24,823.68 for the new www.stanleyhealth.org website
- \$707,193.70 for equipment for the hospital and clinic such as a portable ultrasound, Nurses Call Station, CT Scanner, Bathing System, Bobcat and accessories, Ophthalmoscopes for ER, Urine Analyzer, CR Reader for X-Ray, Glidescope, and our most recent purchase a 3-D Mammography Machine, CT 3-D Reconstruction Workstation and a Digital X-Ray Up-grade
- \$4,784.03 for training for Hospital and Clinic Billing Staff
- \$339,051.00 for the new parking lot and the MCMC Physical Therapy remodel
- \$135,357.14 for Service Contracts for MCMC Equipment

PARTNERING FOR THE FUTURE CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

In October of 2013, the Mountrail County Health Foundation implemented the “Partnering for the Future” Capital Campaign to meet the funding needs of the three construction phases outlined below. With the help of generous local residents, churches, business owners, the T.H. Reiarson Trust, key energy companies and grants, the Foundation has been able to raise just shy of 7 million dollars. Phase One, Phase Two and the first portions of Phase Three are complete and paid in full. Since February of 2019, we have funded \$2.8 million dollars for the build out of Rosen Place on 8th Assisted Living and the Bethel Chapel. Funds were secured by grant writing and private donations. We thank you from the bottom of our hearts for all the support you all have given to enable these projects to become a reality!




