NEW MOUNTRAIL BETHEL HOME PROPOSED FLOOR PLAN



The Mountrail County Health Foundation (MCHF) has been in the *Partnering for the Future* Capital Campaign since 2013. During these last eight years, we have made millions of dollars in investments into healthcare in the local community. With the support of generous residents, churches, businesses, and the T.H. Reiarson, we have completed an ER remodel, CT scanner addition, enclosed ambulance bay, expansion of the T.H. Reiarson Health Annex (Clinic), new employee parking lot, Rosen Place on 8th Assisted Living, the New Bethel Chapel, and the Executive Conference Room.

After several years of diligent planning, we will finally begin the project for replacing Mountrail Bethel Home. The new nursing home facility will be an investment in providing exceptional long-term care to the residents of our shared community. The new facility will provide modern and spacious residencies to our residents who call our campus home.

The new facility totals nearly 40,000 sq. ft. and will have 46 beds for residents. This includes new dining areas, a family room, a nurse's station, and other needed services. The new facility will create a focal point on the stained glass window of Bethel Chapel.

NEW MAIN ENTRANCE

The new facility will provide new entrances to the hospital and the Nursing Home. The exterior of the new Mountrail Bethel Home will complement the existing hospital and clinic. There will be a circular driveway with ample parking for patients and visitors.

Our plans include spaces for outdoor recreation for residents. We will have a walking path and outdoor back patio to enjoy during the spring, summer, and fall months. These spaces will provide many opportunities for activities and events that residents will enjoy.

MODERN AND WARM GREETINGS

Greeting visitors to the new facility will be a modern and warm lobby. Adjacent to the entrance will be a day room, where people can gather for conversation. This space will also serve as a waiting area for the nursing home.

In the center of the new facility, there will be a centralized nurses station. This nurses station will allow staff quick access to the residence rooms in the newly built 4-wing facility. Ample lighting will make this open space inviting for residents, visitors, and staff alike.

The new family room will serve as a gathering space for residents and their families. Complete with a fireplace, kitchenette, and bookshelves, residents can enjoy time with family in a private area together, and celebrate special occasions as a family. The family room leads to a private patio featuring a fire pit and a grill for outdoor family time enjoyment.

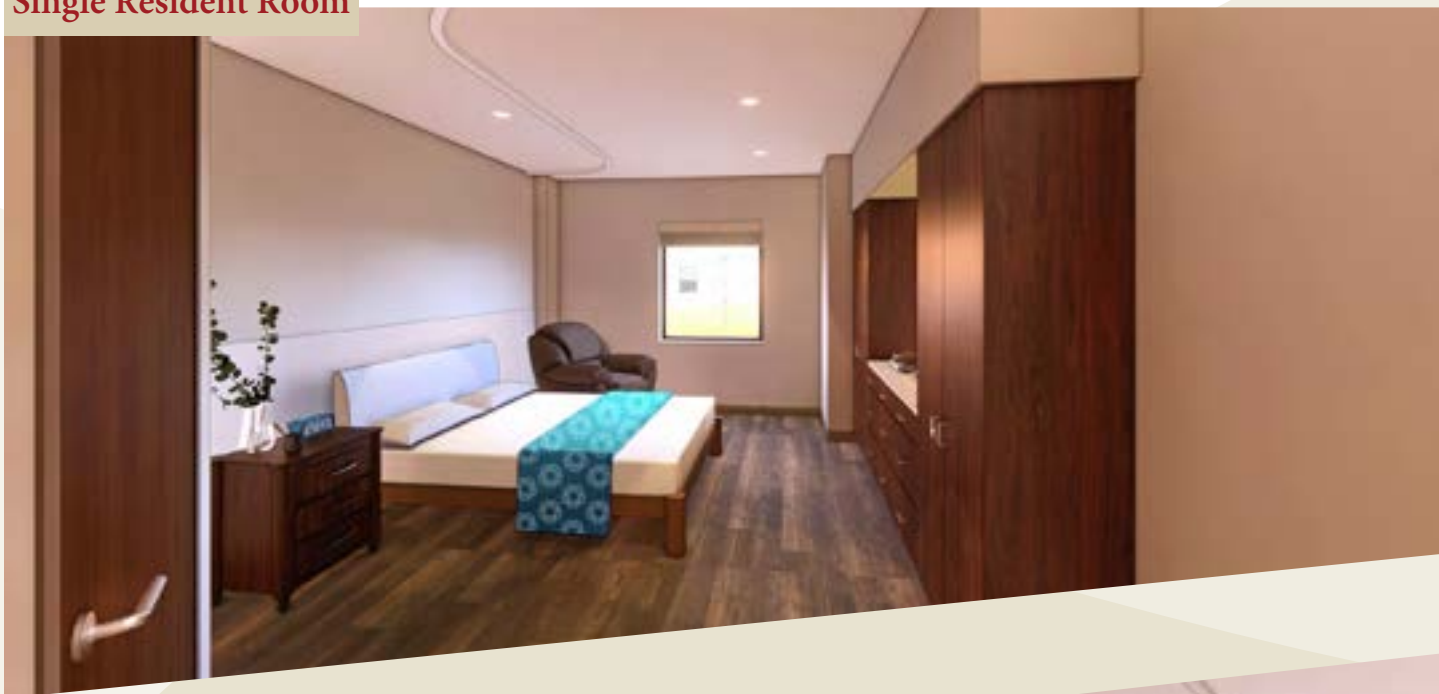
RESIDENT ROOMS

Beginning in 2019, the Mountrail County Health Foundation has been funding the Dare to Define YOU! initiative. This is a leadership program designed to build character, confidence, and courage in our youth community. Since launching we have impacted over 1,200 students and staff through in-person and virtual workshops; our reach on social media with the daily Day-Maker and Red Glasses Movement is positively influencing over 1,000 lives daily.

We launched this initiative as an alternative solution to tackle mental health in our community. We know that when we are better on the inside, it shows on the outside. Our confidence, courage, and character are connected to knowing who we are from the inside out and learning to boldly own it. Our Dare to Define YOU! leadership program is based on this core truth.



With this foundation, all teachings are centered around elevating self-awareness and self-management, as well as defining core values, daily principles and personal standards of excellence that function as a behavioral compass. We're passionate about investing in the self-leadership of our youth, because they are our future!

This year has offered us the opportunity to start building a virtual platform for the Dare to Define YOU! program, which allows us to deliver a sustainable, vibrant and turn-key solution for other schools in our county.

The T.H. Reiarson Trust can only give funding to the Mountrail County Medical Center solely for improvements and equipment.

Mr. Reiarson was a life-long farmer, who lived south of Ross. In his Last Will and Testament, he created this trust for the benefit of the Stanley Community Hospital (SCH). T.H. was specific in his will that the trust be prudently managed by the SCH board. This trust has been helping with improvements for the hospital since the late 1970's. He would be amazed at how his trust could help pay for the following over the past years:

- **\$2,410,406.60** for the building of the T.H. Reiarson Rural Health Clinic
- **\$1,731,577.33** for the Electronic Healthcare Records systems
- **\$249,725.46** for signage, furnishing and technology for the new clinic, such as the new electronic billboard
- **\$24,823.68** for the new www.stanleyhealth.org website
- **\$707,193.70** for equipment for the hospital and clinic such as a portable ultrasound, Nurses Call Station, CT Scanner, Bathing System, Bobcat and accessories, Ophthalmoscopes for ER, Urine Analyzer, CR Reader for X-Ray, Glidescope, 3-D Mammography Machine, CT 3-D Reconstruction Workstation and a Digital X-Ray Up-grade
- **\$4,784.03** for training for Hospital and Clinic Billing Staff
- **\$393,051.00** for the new parking lot, parking lot fence, the MCMC Physical Therapy remodel, new hospital admittance area, and Cat 5 rewiring of the building
- **\$332,631.08** for Service Contracts for MCMC Equipment

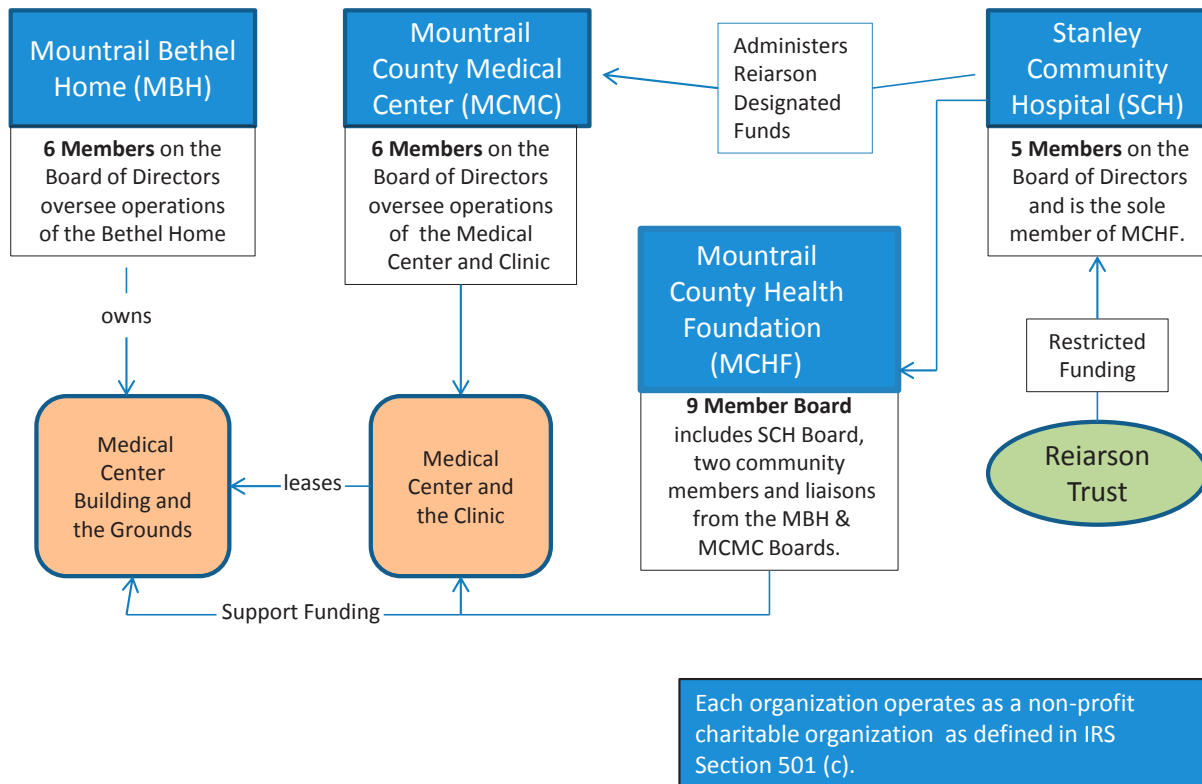

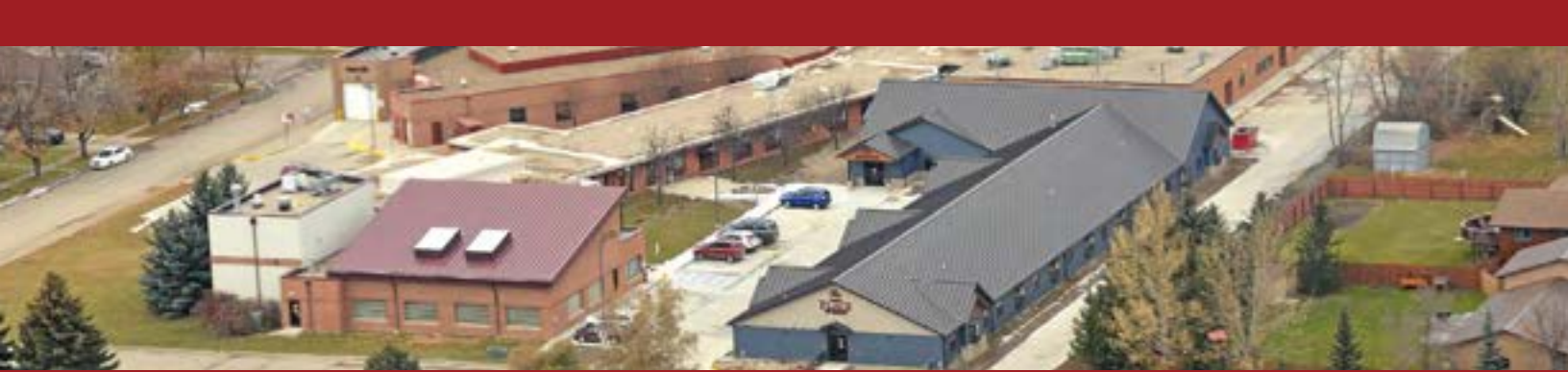

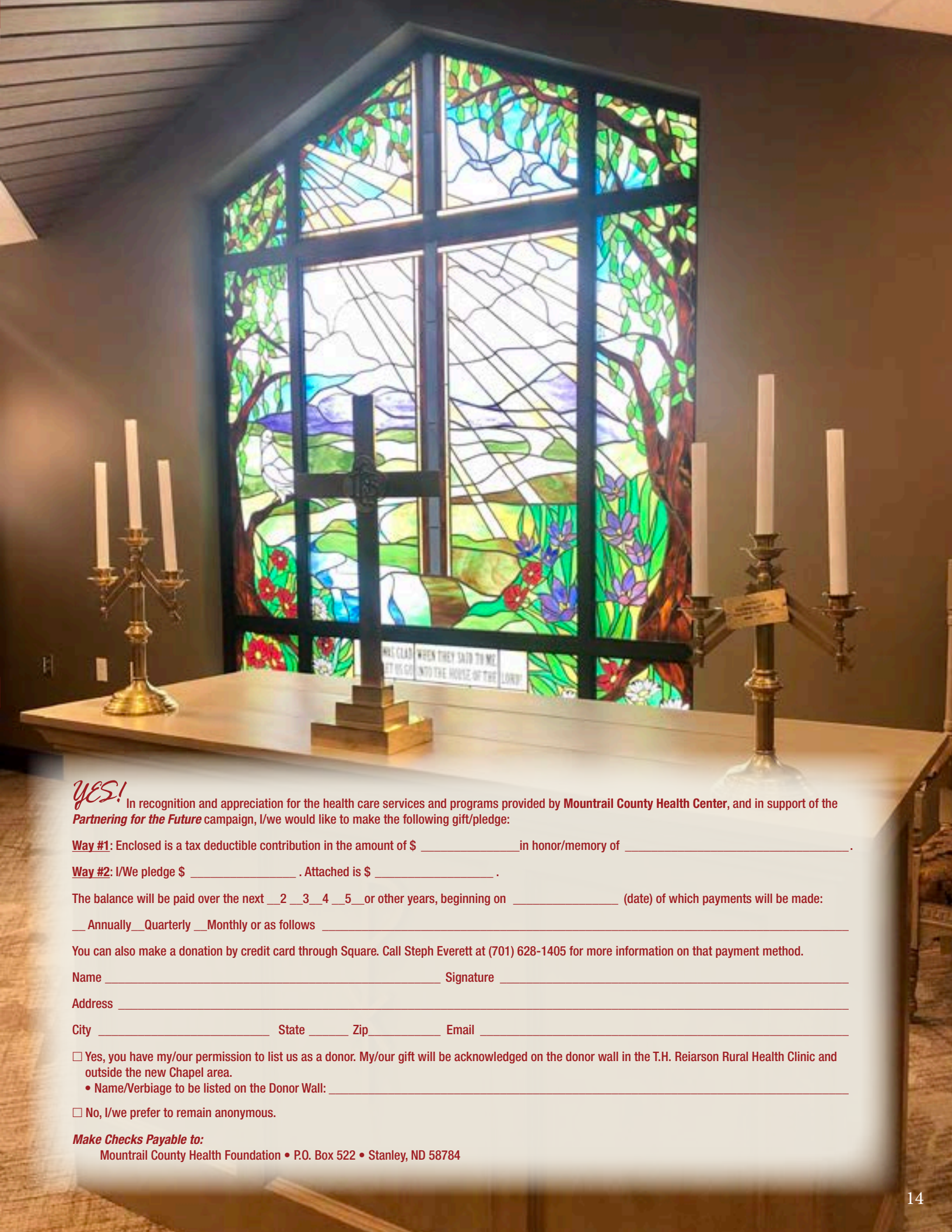
